The Residential Center for Healing & Resilience

For years, hundreds of Idaho kids have been sent out of state for long-term care because the kind of support they needed wasn't available in Idaho. When kids are sent away from their families, their success rates go down and their trauma goes up. The Residential Center for Healing & Resilience will lead the nation in residential care for youth. Our trauma-focused, family-driven model will give Idaho's kids access to the best services available for them.



Therapy & Counseling Centers

Idaho Youth Ranch outpatient therapies use proven, evidence-based models that help youth and families process trauma, learn coping skills, improve communication, and heal. These services are available in person or via Idaho Youth Ranch TeleMental Health.



Hays House

Located in Boise, Idaho, Hays House provides a short-term shelter for youth 9–17 who:



- Have run away or are homeless.
- Are transitioning in foster care.
- Need 24/7 respite care.
- Have home situations where they are not cared for or are unsafe.

Adoption Services



Idaho Youth Ranch adoption services helps families in north Idaho come together through open adoptions. In addition to adoption services like infant placements, home studies, and family support, we provide pregnancy crisis counseling for expectant mothers unsure about which options are best for them.

Equine Therapy



Equine Assisted Psychotherapy (EAP) is a ground-based model that helps youth form a judgment-free bond with horses to promote healing with the guidance of a licensed counselor and equine specialist.

Job Training & Alumni Services

YouthWorks is an 8-week program that offers young people 14–24 paid, hands-on work experience and proven job readiness curriculum. In addition to a paid internship, youth participate in job and career-planning workshops about resume building, job hunting, interview skills, and financial planning.



Thrift Stores

Idaho Youth Ranch has a statewide network of 24 thrift stores that, in addition to providing a critical leg of funding for our programs, offer community support, retail employment opportunities, and a backdrop for our YouthWorks career readiness program.
